### About the Artistes

FITZWILLIAM STRING QUARTET. The quartet was founded in 1968 by four Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge undergraduates who went on to study at the Royal Academy of Music. They became well-known through their close personal association with Dmitri Shostakovich, who befriended them following a visit to York to hear them play. He entrusted them with the Western premieres of his last three quartets, and before long they had become the first group to perform and record all fifteen. The recordings gained international awards and helped them secure a longterm contract with Decca, London. In 2005 the Shostakovich set was included in the Gramophone Magazine's '100 greatest recordings'. The quartet performs a wide repertoire, from the late 17th century to the present day, and are one of the few established groups to play on both modern and historical instrument set-ups.

MISHKA MOMEN (piano). Mishka was born in London in 1992 and has studied with Imogen Cooper at the Guildhall School of Music and periodically with Richard Goode. At the age of 13 she won 1st prize in the Leschetizky Concerto Competition, New York. She has twice been invited by Andras Schiff to participate in his summer class as Gstaad as part of the Menuhin Festival and he has also invited her to give recitals in New York, Frankfurt and Antwerp. In November 2014 she was unanimously voted the 1st prize winner of the Dudley International Piano Competition. In the same year she won 2nd prize at the Cologne International Piano Competition. She has given solo recitals at the Barbican Hall, the Bridgewater Hall, and concert performances at most major London venues.

**RUTH SCHULTEN (violin) AND FRIENDS.** The 'friends' are Benjamin Roskams – violin/viola, Phil Hall – viola, Nicola Tait – cello, Richard Wainright – French horn, Kester Owen – guitar. Ruth (formerly Williams) is well known in Radlett and leads her group in arrangements of well-known tunes used in films. The programme is designed to appeal to all the family and will offer entertainment ideally suited to a Sunday afternoon.

### About the Artistes

JAYSON GILLHAM (piano). Australian-British Jayson has emerged as one of the finest pianists of his generation. Internationally regarded for his compelling performances, he has received numerous awards and prizes, reaching the finals of some of the world's leading piano competitions, including Leeds, Van Cliburn and the Chopin competition; most recently he has won first prize in the Montreal International Piano Competition. Jayson performs across the globe, with engagements with the London Philharmonic, Halle Orchestra, Queensland Symphony and the Orchestre Symphonique de Montreal, and at some of the world's most prestigious venues, including the Wigmore Hall and the Louvre Auditorium.

FUJITA PIANO TRIO. We are pleased to welcome back this trio, consisting of three Japanese sisters, Arisa (violin), Honoka (cello) and Megumi (piano). They have been playing together since early childhood, and debuted at the Wigmore Hall in 1999. Engagements have taken them to over 100 venues in the UK, and overseas they have played in Canada, France, Italy, Ireland, Egypt, Morocco and Turkey. Arisa and Honaka both studied at the Guildhall School of Music (where Arisa now teaches); Megumi at the Menuhin School and the Royal College of Music. The sisters have performed the Beethoven Triple Concerto numerous times with orchestras including the G. Enesku Philharmonic (Romania) and the London Soloists Chamber Orchestra in venues including the Barbican Centre, Queen Elizabeth Hall and the Atheneum Hall (Bucharest).

SHE'KOYOKH KLEZMER GROUP. She'Koyokh is a Yiddish expression meaning 'nice one!'. The band formed in 2001, playing klezmer music – the instrumental Jewish wedding music of Eastern European communities. The group became fascinated by Gypsy music and folk music of the Balkans, travelling to Romania, Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece to study with master musicians. She'Koyokh were hailed by the world music magazine Songlines as Britain's best klezmer and Balkan music band, and were winners of the Netherlands International Jewish music competition. The group have released two albums by ARC Music, the latest of which received a five-star review in Songlines.
