About the Artistes

DAVID OWEN NORRIS. David is a pianist, broadcaster and composer. His oratorio *Prayerbook* will appear in November on CD. The Sunday Times said, "Sign this man up for a series" after his celebrated deconstruction of 'Jerusalem' in the Prince of Wales's television programme about Sir Hubert Parry. His work as a concert pianist has taken him round the world for forty years – "Quite possibly the most interesting pianist in the world!" said the Toronto Globe & Mail. His latest piano solo CD received a double-five-star review in BBC Music Magazine. He is currently working on an app for iPad on Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.

POMEGRANATE TRIO. The Pomegranate piano trio is a fruitful collaboration between award-winning musicians with a passion for chamber music. Fenella Barton, violin, hailed by The Strad as 'gifted and decisive', has given duo recitals at Wigmore Hall and the Purcell Room, and broadcast on BBC radio. Rebecca Hewes, 'cellist, has "a sumptuous, mahogany tone and bold arresting sound, and plays with both power and delicacy" – Fanfare Magazine. Robin Green, pianist, has performed all over the world, and was a participant at the International Musicians' Seminar "Open Chamber Music" last September.

THE HERSCHEL TRIO. The trio specializes in eighteenthcentury chamber repertoire from across Europe played on period instruments. Formed in 2012 they are all well-established exponents of baroque music, and take their name from the wellknown astronomer William Herschel (1738-1822), who was also an oboist in the Hanover Military Band. The trio consists of Graham O'Sullivan, baroque flute and recorder; Susanna Pell, viola da gamba; and Mie Hyashi-O'Sullivan, harpsichord.

MANUS NOBLE, guitar. In his teens, Manus (who is from Ireland) studied with Craig Ogden, who gave us such a memorable concert two years ago. He then went on to the Royal College of Music, and then the Royal Academy. Embarking on his career, he soon drew the highest critical praise: "Another future star was sighted" said The Times. His interest in pushing the technical boundaries of his instrument attracted the attention of composers and led to him giving six world premieres in 2012 alone. A programme note said "his masterly playing, his incredible range of tone colours and his warm stage presence drew us all into his music making".

KRYSIA OSOSTOWICZ, violin. Krysia studied at the Yehudi Menuhin School, at Cambridge University, and in Salzburg. She has performed over twenty concertos with

orchestra, ranging from Bach to Britten and her many recordings have won a number of awards. She has taught at the Guildhall School since 1987.

DANIEL TONG, piano. This is a welcome return for Daniel to Radlett. His musical life is spent performing as soloist and chamber musician as well as directing two chamber music festivals and occasionally writing. He also has a busy teaching career. For 2015 and beyond he is teaming up with violinist Krysia Osostowicz for a series called 'Beethoven Plus!'.

BENYOUNES QUARTET. Winners of the 2012 1st International Sandor Vegh Quartet Competition in Budapest, the quartet is gaining a reputation as one of the most engaging, dynamic and successful young quartets to have emerged from the UK in recent years. Formed in 2007 at the Royal Northern College of Music, the quartet went on to win the Royal Philharmonic Society's prestigious Julius Isserlis Scholarship and won the esteemed Prix d'Excellence at the Haute Ecole de Musique de Geneve. In 2013 they held a residency at St. John's Smith Square. They currently hold a residency at Bangor University.

DAVID CAMPBELL, clarinet. Described by the late Jack Brymer as 'the finest player of his generation', David is internationally recognized as one of Britain's finest musicians. Much of his earlier career was spent as a member of Sir Peter Maxwell Davies's chamber ensemble. Over recent years he has developed both solo and chamber music careers, performing in over 40 countries with leading orchestras and ensembles.
